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REGULATIONS ON THE ADMISSION TO UAUIM FOR FOREIGN APPLICANTS AND ROMANIANS EVERYWHERE

for the 2026/2027 academic year



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CHAPTER 1

Legal framework

Article 1

The admission of foreign applicants is organized in accordance with:

- Law No.199/2023 on Higher Education, as subsequently amended and supplemented;
- Law No.448/2006 on the Protection and Promotion of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities, republished, as subsequently amended and supplemented;
- Regulations on Ensuring Accessibility in Higher Education for Persons with Disabilities, approved by the Order of the Minister of Education No. 4481/2024;
- The Framework Methodology on the Organization of Admission to Higher Education for Short-Cycle, Bachelor's, Master's and Doctoral Studies, approved by the Order of the Minister of Education No. 3693/2024 and published in the Official Gazette of Romania No. 111 of 7th February 2024;
- The principles established by Decision No. 122 of 23rd October 2024 of the Senate of *Ion Mincu* University of Architecture and Urbanism;
- The conditions regarding the organization of admission for Bachelor's and integrated Bachelor's and Master's degree study programmes for the 2025-2026 academic year, approved by the Decision of the UAUIM Board of Administration of 23rd December 2024;
- GOVERNMENT DECISION No. 1653 of 12th December 2024 on the Conditions for Financing Study Scholarships and Specialization and Professional Training/Advanced Training Internships granted to Romanians Everywhere and Foreign Citizens;
- ORDER No. 5516/2024 of 10th July 2024 on the Organization and Conduct of the Preparatory Year of Romanian Language for Foreign Citizens, as subsequently amended and updated;

CHAPTER II

Preliminary provisions

Article 2

(1) This Regulation applies to the following categories of applicants:

- a) Foreign citizens who do not hold Romanian citizenship, the citizenship of another Member State of the European Union, the European Economic Area, or the Swiss Confederation, as well as British citizens and their family members, as beneficiaries of the Agreement on the withdrawal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland from the European Union and the European Atomic Energy Community (2019/C 384 I/01).
- b) Romanians everywhere who, according to the provisions of Article 1 paragraph (2) of Law No. 299/2007, include:
 - i. persons belonging to national minorities, linguistic minorities or indigenous Romanian ethnic groups, or who belong to the Romanian cultural and ethnic heritage, existing in the states neighboring Romania and in other states, who assume their Romanian ethnic, linguistic and cultural identity before the Romanian authorities, regardless of the ethnonym used;
 - ii. Romanian emigrants, whether or not they have retained Romanian citizenship, their descendants, as well as Romanian citizens residing or having their domicile abroad;
 - iii. ethnic persons who identify themselves as being of Romanian origin, located outside the country's borders, registered as another minority in their country of residence, who, through self-identification, assume their belonging to the Romanian cultural and identity space.
 - iv.

Article 3

- (1) Foreign citizens from Member States of the European Union, from states belonging to the European Economic Area, and from the Swiss Confederation, as well as candidates who do not fall within the category of Romanians everywhere, shall participate in the admission process for all cycles of university studies under the same conditions provided by law for Romanian citizens, including with regard to the admission schedule and the tuition fees.
- (2) Candidates belonging to the category of Romanians everywhere, in order to benefit from the rights provided by the legislation in force regarding the conditions of study within state higher education institutions, shall declare,



under their own responsibility, based on their freely expressed will and in compliance with the conditions set out in the Framework Convention for the Protection of National Minorities, that they assume their Romanian cultural identity, regardless of the name used in the state of citizenship or residence to designate the respective minority or community. The standard content of this declaration is presented in ANNEX 5.

- (3) Candidates holding dual citizenship, one of which is Romanian citizenship or the citizenship of an EU Member State, shall submit a *Certificate of recognition and equivalence of studies completed abroad*, issued by the National Centre for Recognition and Equivalence of Diplomas (CNRED) (www.cnred.edu.ro).

Article 4

- (1) Proof of admission for foreign national applicants and Romanians everywhere, for the purpose of obtaining a long-stay visa for studies, is the "Letter of Acceptance for Studies," a document issued by the Ministry of Education.
- (2) Foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere may participate in the admission process organized by UAUIM for Bachelor's, Master's, and Doctoral studies in accredited fields/study programmes or in study programmes authorized to operate provisionally, for which the university may organize final graduation examinations, in accordance with the legal provisions in force and within the approved student capacity, with fee-paying study places and tuition fees payable in foreign currency.

Article 5

- (1) Pursuant to the provisions of Order of the Minister of Education No. 5552/2024, Romanians everywhere may be enrolled in the following study places:
 - a) tuition-free places with a monthly scholarship;
 - b) tuition-free places without a monthly scholarship;
 - c) fee-paying places with tuition fees payable in lei.
- (2) Foreign citizens may be enrolled in the following study places:
 - a) tuition-free places with a monthly scholarship;
 - b) tuition-free places without a monthly scholarship;
 - c) fee-paying places with tuition fees payable in foreign currency.



Article 6

- (4) Candidates holding dual citizenship, one of which is Romanian citizenship or the citizenship of an EU Member State, and who do not fall within the category of Romanians everywhere, may apply only using their non-EU citizenship. In this regard, upon registration for the admission competition, they shall submit a notarized declaration certifying that, although they also hold Romanian citizenship, they choose, under their own responsibility, to pursue studies on a self-funded basis in foreign currency.

Article 7

- (1) The amount of tuition fees in foreign currency for foreign citizens from non-EU third countries is established pursuant to Government Ordinance No. 22 of 29 August 2009 regarding the establishment of the minimum amount of tuition fees, in foreign currency, for citizens studying on their own account in Romania, from states that are not members of the European Union, as well as from states that are not part of the European Economic Area or the Swiss Confederation, and is included in the list of university fees and charges applicable for the academic year 2026–2027, approved by the UAUIM Senate.

CHAPTER III

Admission requirements

Article 8

- (1) Foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere are entitled to participate in the admission process organized by UAUIM for Bachelor's degree, integrated Bachelor's and Master's degree, Master's degree, and Doctoral degree programmes, in the accredited fields of study/specializations/study programmes or those authorized to operate on a provisional basis, in accordance with the applicable legal provisions, within UAUIM, provided that they cumulatively meet the following conditions:
 - a) they hold a high school graduation diploma (Baccalaureate diploma), a Bachelor's degree diploma, a Master's degree diploma, or an equivalent qualification, as applicable, and meet the admission requirements for higher education studies in their country of origin;
 - b) by way of exception to point (a), holders of long-cycle higher education diplomas who, under the legislation of their country of origin, are entitled to enroll in doctoral studies without the obligation to complete the second cycle of higher education (Master's degree)



may, with the consent of the receiving university, benefit from the rights granted to them in their country of origin.

- c) they hold a valid passport with an entry visa for Romania for study purposes (valid for at least six months from the commencement of the study programme for which they are applying) or, in the case of applicants who are Romanians living abroad, a valid identity document permitting residence in Romania.
- d) they are not subject to any restrictive measures imposed by the Romanian authorities or by European or international institutions.

Article 9

- (1) Participation in the admission process for study programmes delivered in Romanian is conditional upon demonstrating the required proficiency in the Romanian language, which may be evidenced by one of the following:
 - a) submission of a certificate of completion of the Romanian language preparatory year programme;
 - b) submission of Romanian educational documents (diplomas and certificates) or other educational documents and academic records certifying at least three consecutive years of study completed in Romanian at a school or higher education institution within Romania's national education system;
 - c) submission of a Romanian Language Proficiency Certificate at a minimum level of B1, in accordance with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR), issued by Romanian higher education institutions accredited to provide the Romanian language preparatory year programme for foreign citizens, accredited pre-university educational institutions authorized to provide introductory Romanian language courses, the Romanian Language Institute, or the Romanian Cultural Institute.
- (2) Participation in the admission process for study programmes delivered in English is subject to meeting the requirements established by UAUIM. In accordance with the General Admission Regulations, applicants to the Faculty of Architecture for the English-taught study programme are also required to take an eliminatory English language proficiency test, which is assessed on a Pass/Fail basis. Further details are provided in the *Regulations on the Organization of Admission to Bachelor's Degree and Integrated Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes for the 2026/2027 Academic Year*.



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Article 10

- (1) The completion of the admission process for foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere is subject to obtaining the Letter of Acceptance to Studies issued by the Romanian Ministry of Education and Research.

CHAPTER IV

Issuance of the letter of acceptance to studies

Article 11

- (1) Applicants' files for the issuance of the Letter of Acceptance to Studies shall be submitted directly to UAUIM International Students Office, either by post or by e-mail to argentina_uta@yahoo.com. The university shall assess the application file and submit the list of applicants proposed for the issuance of a Letter of Acceptance to Studies to the Ministry of Education and Research – General Directorate for International Relations and European Affairs in accordance with the standard form template. The list shall be accompanied by an electronic copy of each applicant's file. The number of files submitted must not exceed the maximum number of students that the institution is authorized to enroll, in accordance with the applicable regulations. Following the evaluation of the application files, the Ministry of Education shall issue and forward the Letters of Acceptance to Studies to the higher education institutions.
- (2) The application period for submitting files to UAUIM for the issuance of the Letter of Acceptance to Studies, admission to Bachelor's degree, integrated Bachelor's and Master's degree, and Doctoral degree programmes for the 2026/2027 academic year, in accredited fields of study/specializations/study programmes or those authorized to operate on a provisional basis, is 1st July – 25th July. Incomplete application files shall not be processed and shall be rejected.
- (3) The application period for submitting files to UAUIM for the issuance of the Letter of Acceptance to Studies and the admission to Romanian-taught Master's degree studies at the Faculty of Urbanism within UAUIM for the 2026/2027 academic year is 1st July – 7th July. Incomplete application files shall not be processed and shall be rejected.



CHAPTER V

Application file for the letter of acceptance to studies

Article 12

- (1) The application file for the issuance of the Letter of Acceptance to Studies, depending on the study cycle, shall contain the following documents, submitted in copy and certified translation into one of the following languages: Romanian, English, or French, as applicable:
- a) the application form for the issuance of the Letter of Acceptance to Studies (ANNEX 4), communicated annually by the Ministry of Education and Research to higher education institutions;
 - b) the birth certificate;
 - c) the passport;
 - d) the high school graduation diploma, according to the list communicated by the Ministry of Education and Research, as well as the Bachelor's degree diploma, Master's degree diploma, or Doctoral degree diploma, as applicable, or their equivalent, apostilled/authenticated by the competent authorities in the issuing country;
 - e) the certificate confirming the successful completion of the baccalaureate/bachelor's degree/dissertation examination for graduates of the current year;
 - f) annual transcripts/ diploma supplements/ course descriptions, as applicable;
 - g) the certificate of completion of the preparatory year programme in the Romanian language or the language proficiency certificate, as applicable;
 - h) the preliminary approval of a PhD supervisor/doctoral school, as applicable, the doctoral research project related to the PhD topic for which the candidate is applying, and the curriculum vitae, as applicable;
 - i) the minutes of the equivalency committee, indicating the year of study in which candidates may be enrolled and any additional/differential examinations to be taken, as established by each university/faculty, based on the comparison of curricula and course syllabi. The responsibility for verifying the authenticity of the submitted documents lies with UAUIM, through direct correspondence with the educational institutions that issued the academic documents, based on the candidate's written consent;
 - j) the medical certificate issued in the candidate's country of residence, certifying that the person intending to enroll in a study programme does not suffer from contagious diseases or other conditions incompatible with university studies, translated, where applicable, into Romanian, English, or French;



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- k) a copy of the marriage certificate or any other document certifying a change of name, if applicable;

CHAPTER VI

Organization of the admission process and the admission results

Article 13

- (1) Pursuant to the provisions of Order of the Minister of Education No. 5655/2024, higher education institutions shall develop and implement their own regulations for the organization of admission of foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere to the study programmes they offer.
- (2) The admission competition for foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere, organized by UAUIM for **bachelor's degree studies, integrated bachelor's and master's degree studies, and doctoral studies**, in accredited or provisionally authorized fields/specializations/study programmes, **shall be organized in September**, based on the following regulations, as applicable:
- a) *Regulations on the Organization of Admission to Bachelor's Degree and Integrated Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes for the 2026/2027 Academic Year*

- (3) The admission competition for foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere, organised by UAUIM for **master's degree studies at the Faculty of Urbanism** within UAUIM, **shall be held in July**, in accordance with the *Regulations on the Admission Competition for First-Year Master's Degree Programmes at the Faculty of Urbanism.*

Article 14

- (1) Registration for the admission competition at the "Ion Mincu" University of Architecture and Urbanism shall be carried out online at <https://admitere.uauim.ro/inscriere>, by following the instructions and completing the online application form.
- (2) To complete the online application form, applicants must upload scanned or photographed copies of the documents specified in ANNEX 7 (for foreign citizens) and ANNEX 8 (for Romanians everywhere). Where applicable, the documents must include the applicant's handwritten signature.

Article 15

- (1) The admission examination for foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere applying for Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes in the accredited fields of study/specializations/study programmes differs according to the faculty and study programme (specialization).
- (2) The admission examination for foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere applying for the Bachelor's, Integrated Bachelor's and Master's, and Master's degree programmes offered by the Faculties of **Architecture, Interior Architecture, and Urbanism** within UAUIM consists of the following examinations:
 - a) Qualifying examination (oral examination) in English language proficiency, required only for applicants who have chosen the **English-taught Architecture** programme.
 - b) Single admission examination, consisting of a practical graphic representation test designed to assess the applicant's artistic aptitude in the field of architecture or urbanism, as applicable.
- (3) The admission examination for foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere applying for the **Master's degree programmes offered by the Faculty of Urbanism** within UAUIM consists of the following examinations:
 - a) Qualifying examination in language proficiency, conducted in accordance with the *Regulations for the First-Year Admission Competition to the Master's Degree Programmes of the Faculty of Urbanism* within UAUIM.

 - b) Portfolio assessment (qualifying examination) and an oral interview based on a statement of purpose, for applicants to the Master's degree programmes offered by the Faculty of Urbanism within UAUIM.



- (4) The admission examination for foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere applying for Doctoral Study Programmes within UAUIM consists of the following examinations:
- a) Qualifying examination (**written test**) in **English or French** language proficiency, assessed on a pass/fail basis, or the submission of a Language Proficiency Certificate in an internationally used language (English, French, German, Italian, or Spanish), valid on the date of the admission examination, issued by accredited language centres, with a level corresponding to at least the B2 international proficiency level, in accordance with the *Regulations on the Organization of the Admission Competition for Doctoral Study Programmes at UAUIM*.
 - b) Examination **A**: Assessment of the admission file prepared in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations on the Organization of the Admission Competition for Doctoral Study Programmes at UAUIM.
 - c) Examination **B**: Oral examination / interview.

Article 16

- (1) The assessment and ranking of foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere participating in the admission competition organized by UAUIM shall be carried out in accordance with the Regulations approved by the Senate of UAUIM for the following academic year, applicable to Bachelor's degree programmes, integrated Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes, Master's degree programmes, and Doctoral Study Programmes, in the accredited or provisionally authorized fields of study/specializations/study programmes.
- a) For the Bachelor's degree programmes and Integrated Bachelor's and Master's degree programmes offered by the Faculties of Architecture, Interior Architecture, and Urbanism within UAUIM, the General Admission Average (GAA) must be at least 6.00 (six) and is calculated as the weighted average of the Baccalaureate Examination Average (BEA) — representing 30% of the General Admission Average — and the Admission Examination Score (AES) obtained through the assessment of the examination components, in accordance with the *Regulations on the Organization of Admission to Bachelor's Degree Programmes and Integrated Bachelor's and Master's Degree Programmes for the academic year 2026/2027*.
$$GAA = 30\% \times BEA + 70\% \times AES$$
 - b) For the Master's degree programmes offered by the Faculty of Urbanism within UAUIM, the General Admission Average (GAA) is



calculated as the weighted average of the following components: the grade obtained in the oral examination and the grade obtained in the Bachelor's degree examination, in accordance with the *Regulations on the Admission Competition for the First Year of Master's Degree Programmes within the Faculty of Urbanism*. The final grade will be calculated according to the following formula: the grade obtained in the oral examination will account for 80%, and the grade obtained in the bachelor's degree examination will account for 20%.

- c) For Doctoral Study programmes, the minimum Admission Grade (AG) is 7.00 (seven) and is calculated as the weighted average of the two grades corresponding to the A (Md) and B (Me) assessment components, in accordance with the *Regulations on the organization of the admission competition for Doctoral Study programmes within UAUIM*. $AG = Md \times 0.4 + Me \times 0.6$

CHAPTER VII

Student enrollment

Article 17

- (1) Enrollment of foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere in university studies is conditional upon passing the admission examination/competition and obtaining the Letter of Acceptance to Studies issued by the Ministry of Education and Research (M.E.C.).
- (2) The enrollment of foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere shall be carried out by decision of the Rector, in accordance with the legislation in force.
- (3) Upon enrollment, candidates shall submit the original study and identity documents included in the application file, together with the Letter of Acceptance to Studies, where applicable, and the passport with a valid visa for the purpose of "studies", as appropriate.
- (4) Original study documents issued in states that are parties to the Hague Convention on Apostille must be endorsed by the competent authorities of the issuing countries with the Hague Apostille. For states that are not parties to the Hague Convention on Apostille, the documents must be authenticated by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the issuing country and by the Romanian embassy/consular office in the respective country.
- (5) Until enrollment in the first year of study, candidates declared admitted cannot be issued certificates confirming their student status, as they do not have an institutional relationship with UAUIM until that point, since they have not yet been enrolled. Upon request, only certificates confirming the admission result may be issued.



- (6) Upon enrollment, higher education institutions shall record the names of foreign citizens in academic documents according to the information provided in their passports. The same name shall be recorded on the documents issued upon completion of studies (diploma, diploma supplement).
- (7) Higher education institutions are required to conclude study contracts between enrolled students and the Rector of the university, in accordance with the legal provisions in force.
- (8) After enrollment, foreign citizens shall be registered in the matriculation register under a unique number, valid for the entire period of study in the specialization/study programme to which they have been admitted.

CHAPTER VIII

Final provisions

Article 18

- (1) Foreign citizens and Romanians everywhere enrolled in study programmes in Romania shall have the following obligations:
 - a) to comply with the Constitution of Romania and the laws in force of the State of Romania;
 - b) to comply with the UAUIM regulations;
 - c) to comply with the provisions of this Methodology;
 - d) after obtaining the Letter of Acceptance to Studies, to report to the higher education institution to which they have been admitted for enrollment;
 - e) to report to the General Inspectorate for Immigration within the Ministry of Internal Affairs in order to obtain a residence permit in Romania, valid for the entire duration of their studies.

Article 19 This Regulation was approved at the Senate meeting held on June 25, 2026, pursuant to Senate Resolution.
